1. The District ran a total of 37 calls for the month of February 2020

- 2. Projects currently working on;
 - a. ISO rating Continue to work on this project
 - b. District Policy, Procedure and SOG Manual This is an ongoing project
 - c. Video Surveillance About 50% completed
 - d. Radio's 800 Radios are here, just waiting on WCCCA to program them. We have two back, Trampas and I are using to make sure they are programmed correctly. They will be programming the rest shortly.

3. Grants

- a. AFG SCBA's Ordered. Update Scott has found a problem with the new masks and are working to correct it and have them certified by NFPA by June 2020. We are working with the vendor to obtain some bottles for our old packs that will keep us in compliance until June when the new SCBA's will arrive.
- b. Safer Act Waiting on the FEMA Go website to come up so we can start requesting funds.
- c. Homeland Security Grant has been submitted for 7 new Mobile Radio's.
- d. Submitted a joint grant with YFPD for 2 vests to the Siletz Tribal Grant
- 4. March 10, 11, and 12, 2020 I will be attending a free FEMA Grant management class in Wilsonville.
- 5. On May 11, 2020 I will be attending a free Fire Code update class in Newport. This is a one-day class and will leave that morning and return that evening. I would request that we move the Board Meeting from the 11th to Tuesday the 12th for May as I don't know if I would be back in time for the meeting and to have things ready.
- 6. Working on the 2020-2021 Budget, does the Board have anything that they would like to see included or not included in the 2020-2021 budget?
- 7. Rescue 4 went in today (3-9-2020) and had new tires put on and aligned.

- 8. Dropped the District Satellite Phone as the cost keeps going up and was currently at 1230.79 for the year to renew. We did not use this phone at all last year. We are looking at the cost to add a cell phone booster to the Command vehicle and to the Station. Rough numbers for the Command vehicle are about \$800.
- 9. The Volunteers are busy working on the Easter Egg hunt for this year. The 4-H group is no longer doing it and the Volunteers have stepped up to keep it going.
- 10. The community club has purchased 120 new chairs and 2 racks to hold them. These will be used for the breakfasts and events at the Fire Station. Looking at having a rack built to hold the tables.
- 11. Trampas and I met with A&E on Friday. The software that controls are key fobs and doors is no longer being supported with Microsoft retiring windows 7. The company has come out with a new software for are system and is currently offering 50% discount on all hardware that we exchange in for new. The new system would be encrypted so that people cannot clone your fobs and gain access. We have been told that you can currently take your fob to Portland and there are places that will clone it for \$29.95. A&E is working on a total cost to upgrade and then to add some additional access points.
